CASTLE ROCK STATE PARK

CASTLE ROCK TRAIL

EASY (1HR)

From the Robert C. Kirkwood Entrance, take the Castle Rock trail through the old parking lot around Castle Rock — the world-renowned hiking tafoni sandstone formation. From there, return to the old parking lot and take the Waterfall Trail down until you see a bridge crossing the stream. Go across the bridge and you will soon reach the Native Plants Demonstration Garden, which shows plants that native Californians used for food, medicine, and utilitarian needs. Continue up the path to reach the Sempervirens Fund Welcome Plaza at the Kirkwood Entrance.

SARATOGA GAP TRAIL

MODERATE (1.5 - 2.5HRS)

From the Robert C. Kirkwood Entrance, walk down through the native plants garden to the new connector trail to the Waterfall Trail. At the trail fork, the path on the right will lead you up to Goat Rock on the Ridge Trail, where you can enjoy sweeping views of the Santa Cruz Mountains. The path on the left will take you down to the Castle Rock Falls Overlook (a deck with railings) on the Saratoga Gap Trail. For the adventurous, both the Saratoga Gap Trail and the Ridge Trail continue and loop together via the Connector Trail or the longer route through the Castle Rock Campground.

TRAVERTINE SPRINGS TRAIL

STRENUOUS (6HRS+)

Follow the directions for Moderate Hike (left), but continue past the Castle Rock Trail Camp via the connector trail to the Travertine Springs Trail. From here, you will reach the Saratoga Toll Road Trail, which to the right connects to Saratoga Gap (and the Skyline-to-the-Sea Trail) or to the left, which takes one further down to the edge of the park and other connector trails. Be very aware how long it takes you to reach this point, since it will take you at least as long to return to the Robert C. Kirkwood Entrance. The entrance closes at 8:00 p.m. every day. Campers should park the old parking lot.
